## Transition and retriment in Croatia

Republic of Croatia became an independent country 20 years ago. From the former Yugoslavia has emerged as the strongest economy and the small number of unemployed.

Homeland War 1991 - 1995 destroyed human, financial and economic picture Croatian.

Tens of thousands killed, hundreds of thousands of refugees and displaced people, destroyed villages and towns were destroyed and looted the economy. The Homeland War was actively involved over 500,000 people. Tens of thousands of them went to war with his job. The war has caused high unemployment. In such circumstances in Croatia occurred Transition.

**First** part of us was destroyed in the war and never rebuilt.

**The second** part of firms sold to foreign investors, but they continued to work.

**The third** part (banks and telecommunications) were sold to foreign companies that reap very high commission.

**The fourth** part of domestic investors have taken - yesterday's communists who quit many jobs. They became the greatest fighters for democracy and human and labour rights. Thousands of war veterans no longer had his job, and did not have any employment opportunities. State attempts to employ veterans have not brought positive results.

In this state, the state has many thousands of retired veterans - young and capable of working. The State temporarily reduced number of unemployed, increased the number of pensioners, but forgot to sociological problems - young retirees. In the labour market came to break the continuity of the workforce. Companies have lost their professional and experienced workforce, and young workers did not know and could not take the responsibility.

The global financial crisis has increased the number of unemployed, especially over 55 years. Many people seek shelter in early retirement. Companies are paying high severance payments and thus reduce the number of employees. At the same time not open to new jobs.

Today, the number of "young" retirees very much, and money for pensions is smaller. Under the pressure applied to the pension fund's retirement age - 60 for women retiring from the 65th Currently being discussed about retirement with 67 for all (male and female).

I think that the main pension funds.

**First**, organizational and professional were not ready for transition.

**The second**, not independence - a large dependence on the politic.

**The third**, risky investments and irresponsible business led to the crisis fund.

Older workers are afraid of retirement, and because many work tasks below the level of their professional qualities.

Also, many people, after retirement, will remain working in their companies for several years.
